NEW INUIT OWNED CANADIAN VESSEL DELIVERS HOPE FOR ARCTIC

Iqaluit / July 2, 2008 – Nunavut Eastern Arctic Shipping Inc. (<u>www.NEAS.ca</u>) is pleased to announce that its newest vessel, the *MV Qamutik*, arrived safely in Canada on Canada Day.

After its official inauguration ceremony on July 7th, the *MV Qamutik* sets sail for Canada's Eastern Arctic. The *MV Qamutik* represents the third major financial investment in Canadian vessel ownership by Inuit Birthright Corporations. The *MV Umiavut* and the *MV Avataq* were purchased by NEAS in 2000 and 2007 respectively.

"We are committed to delivering for Canada's Arctic communities the most advanced, cost effective and reliable sealift services available," said Suzanne Paquin, President of Transport Nanuk and Vice President at NEAS. "We are looking to the federal government to respect the Coasting Trade Act and stop unfair competition from foreign vessels and foreign crews in Canada's Arctic waters this sealift season."

NEAS is a pioneer and industry leader in the provision of sealift and related transportation services across Canada's Arctic. NEAS is an Inuit majority owned venture between Qikiqtaaluk Corporation, Sakku Investments Corporation, Makivik Corporation and Transport Nanuk Inc. Over the Arctic navigation season, from July to November, NEAS vessels deliver a variety of goods including construction materials, vehicles, heavy equipment, house wares and non-perishable items to local communities.
